**The first ethno-linguistic census of Honduras, 1895:  
from original manuscripts in the Archivo Nacional de Honduras,  
with brief comparative notes from the 1887 census.**

## **Introduction.**

During the last two decades of the 19<sup>th</sup> century, the government of Honduras conducted its first three “national censuses,” in 1881, 1887, and 1895. With each census, information about the indigenous population improved. The Director of the first count, Francisco Cruz, admitted that the census was deficient, especially in omitting much of the indigenous component. Cruz explained that native habitations were often located in isolated mountainous sites and the peoples of Yoro and La Mosquitia lived without civil organization (Vallejo 1893: 136). No figures were offered for native people in the 1881 census. The 1887 census, as published by Antonio Vallejo (1888), lists 1,261 settlements, 668 of which reported at least one native person. However, specific ethnicities were not recorded. The “raza” category included only two possibilities: “ladinos” and “indígenas.” In December 1895, another census, published by Perry (1899) and Davidson (2002) recorded 3,162 places, also with no mention of ethnicity.


In 1994, geographer Taylor Mack directed my attention to an unorganized collection of individual manuscript sheets of the original 1895 census on the fourth floor of the Archivo Nacional de Honduras. We eventually found some 80,000 sheets (approximately 800 booklets of 50 two-sided census forms, see figure 1). Many of the sheets were torn, much writing was illegible, and many booklets were damaged and fragmented. Still, from the horribly incomplete record 411 places were found to have indigenous residents, many of whom often can be identified according to ethnicity and native language. No manuscripts were found from Islas de la Bahía, La Paz, or Gracias. Very few existed from Comayagua and the few sites in Valle were incorporated into data from Choluteca. See Table 1.

Together, the censuses of 1895 and 1887, taken over an eight years period, present the first available, although quite incomplete, picture of the distribution and sizes of Honduran ethnic peoples and their settlements - 904 places had at least one native resident. See appendices I and II for lists of all places, alphabetically, and by culture group.

The *Pliego de Empadronamiento* for the 1895 census asked two critical questions that determine ethno-linguistic carácter of the different groups: (n. 2) "De qué raza es?" and (n. 12) "Qué idioma ó qué dialecto habla?" At least 31 terms were used to answer the *raza* inquiry: *Amarillo(a), Americano(a), Blanco(a), Caribe, Caucaciano(a), Centro-American(a), Cobriso(a), Español(a), Hicaca, Hicaque, Hispano-American(a), Indígeno(a), Indio(a), Ladino(a), Mestizo(a), Misto(a), Moreno(a), Mulato(a), Negro(a), Palla, Paya, Sajon(a), Sambo(a), Selvatico(a), Sumo(a), Trigueno(a), Ycaca, Ycaquez, Yndijene, Yndio(a), y Zambo(a)*; nine languages were mentioned: *Castellaño, Español, Hicaque, Inglés, Moreno, Mosquito, Paya, Sumo, and Zambo*. At least **3,162 places**, occupied by 398,877 people, were listed in the census. One year later, the *División Político Territorial* (Honduras DGE 1896: 97), undoubtedly taken from the 1895 census, lists **3,028 "lugares habitados."**


In the 1895 manuscript census, 411 places reported least one indigenous resident. Of these, 279 can be identified ethnically, based on the historical record, toponymia, and languages reported in the 1895 census. Except for the Tawahka and Negro Inglés, the geographical distance between the farthest settlements in the ethnic regions is surprisingly large, between 140 and 340 kilometers. See Table 2 and Map 1.

For comparative purposes, the census of 1887 is useful to confirm or contest settlements and their populations or to add places not found in the count of 1895. One hundred and thirty-five towns were reported in both censuses. For a few examples of the value of comparisons note: Langue, the largest indigenous settlement reported in 1887, was not found among the 1895 manuacritps; Jocón (Yoro) reported “2 indigenas” in 1887 and “223 hicaques” in 1895; Duyure recorded “8 indigenas” in 1887 and “314 indios” eight years later. In all instances, the 1895 manuscript census is more detailed and therefore must be considered as more likely correct.

**1887 settlement sizes.** Of the twentieth largest indigenous settlements, those over 500 inhabitants, only two were out of the Lenca region: Catacamas had 573 “indios,” probably Pech, and Ocotepeque was home to 521 “indios,” probably Chortí. Other large Lenca places were Marcala (926), Opotoro (901) and Lepaterique (860). The largest Tol sites were Cataguana (347) and Yorito (278). Yamanta had 300 Miskito inhabitants, probably estimated. Few Garífuna villages were in the census and no Tawahka and Negro Ingles settlements were mentioned.

### Brief Comentary on the Ethnic Groups and their Regions, 1895

Previous attempts to map the distribution of ethnics groups in Honduras are numerous. Most are estimations determined from language use and places names. By far the best regionalization is from Mosquitia, where Herlihy and Leake conducted extensive fieldwork supported by local Miskitu, Tawahka, Pech, and Garífuna informants: “Tierras Indígenas de La Moquitia Hondureña - 1992: Zonas de Subsistencia.” The map was published in 1993 by the Instituto Geográfico Nacional, Tegucigalpa.

The ethnic census of 2001 allowed for mapping of the core homelands of the seven groups below (Davidson 2011a, b: 58, 120, 144, 154, 172, 178, 189, 196). Other ethnic maps are noted in the sections below.

Northwestern Olancho, El Paraíso, and much of Choluteca cannot be placed into one of the major ethnic regions. The so-called “Indians of El Paraíso” have been difficult to categorize ethnically or linguistically (Cruz 1984: 435), but may be related to the so-called “Matagalpans” of northern Nicaragua.

### **Lenca, 1895.**

The Lenca are by far the largest indigenous group in Honduras. They occupy much of the western and central portions of the country and in the 1895 census they lived in at least 372 settlements. However, the 1895 census did not identify the group by race or language – most were simply called “indios” and many spoke “español.” The Lenca are located primarily by their prominent and well-known toponyms such as *caran*, *era*, *guala*, *laca*, *lepa*, *yagua*, etc. (West 1998).

While the borders of their ethnic region have been suggested previously (Chapman 1978; Davidson 1987) no precise delimitation is yet proposed. Based on Lenca toponyms, such as “*yus* (pine), *caran* (mountains), and *guare* (stream),” parts of Choluteca and El Paraíso might have been once occupied by Lenca. Yusguare (Choluteca) and Yuscaran (El Paraíso) certainly are Lenca toponyms, but are considered as outliers beyond the Lenca region. Further, the Lenca-Tol and Lenca-Pech borders are problematic. For previous mapping see Cruz 1984: 426; Chapman (1978), and Davidson (1985a: 220; 1987)

### **Hicaque (Tol, Torupán), 1895.**

Some of the most detailed census gathering in 1895 took places among the so-called Hicaques. This was so perhaps because many were easily identified by the Tol language they spoke and because they occupied areas known from the mission days of Padre Subirana (Davidson 1984).

Hicaque speakers can be located in 111 settlements, reaching from Asacualpa (Macuelizo, Santa Bárbara) to Agalteca (Olanchito, Yoro, and perhaps to nearby Yaruka). Clearly the core of Tol/Hicaque settlement was Yoro where 44 sites are known. Another, little known enclave west of the Ulúa valley was discovered in the manuscripts. This zone of western Tol near San Pedro Sula includes indigenous residents in El Palmar (26), Baracoa, Tulian Arriba (7), Calpules (24), and La Cumbre (71). A little to the south in southern Cortés, east and just north of Lake Yojoa, another group of villages – Los Caminos, Naranjos, La Ceiba, San Antonio, La Quesera, Río Comayagua recorded “hicaques.” For previous mapping see Cruz 1984: 426; Chapman (1992), and Davidson (1985a: 220; 1985b)

### **Chortí, 1895.**

Fourty-five places can be identified as Chortí Maya in the census. Much of the classification comes from notations stating in at least nine places "Indios de Guatemala," recently arrived. The one outlier site is Palos Blancos (now Chachaguala, just west of Omoa). Here an unknown number of Chortí entered Honduras, crossing on the trail from the lower Motagua river.

The largest Chortí villages were in the south of Copán (now Depto. de Ocotepeque) in Ocotepeque (pop. 521 indios in 1887; incomplete document in 1895) and Dolores, near Sinuapa (pops: 268 "indios" in 1895; 344 in 1887). For mapping see Cruz 1984: 426, 439; Davidson 1985: 220)

### **Paya (Pech), 1895.**

At Contact with Europeans, during the fourth voyage of Columbus in 1504, it is probable that the Pech occupied the Caribbean littoral between Cape Cameron and perhaps as far west as modern La Ceiba. The offshore islands in the Bay of Honduras were also Pech lands (Davidson 1991, 2002). By 1895 the Pech appear to live in four areas: Valle de Agalta, headwaters of the río Wampú, and the middle ríos Plátano and Pauylaya.

Manuscripts of the 1895 census contain information on eleven locations occupied primarily by over 700 Pech. In these documents the ethnic group was mostly identified as "palla,"

The largest concentration of Pech seems to have been in modern El Carbón, some 35 km. north of San Esteban. The village, which was granted lands by Padre Subirana in 1862 (Davidson 1984: 453), was known as San Pedro in the 1895 census. It has also been known as "Santa María del Carbón."

A few Pech, perhaps a dozen or so, lived outside their own villages. Places listing "pallas" residents include Río Plátano (2), Pau (1), Ulán (1), Trujillo and La Ceiba. Some of the "indios" near Tocoa, such as in Concepción, are probably Pech.

Evidence of acculturation in the Agalta Valley can be seen in the censuses taken in San Esteban, the cabecera municipal, Conquire, and Pacura. San Esteban listed 100 mestizos; Conquire is described as a ladino town of 65, plus two mestizos; and Pacura was of "26 mestisos." All of these sites were once, and later, known to be occupied by Pech (Goicoechea 1807).

Examples of 1895 booklets with clusters of Pech sites are below:

- 1) "Censo general de las aldeas de Aguaquire y Punta de Piedra del términos municipal del Pueblo Yndigena de El Dulce Nombre , Departamento de Olancho, 26 dic. de 1895." Booklet numbered 52.

The Aguaquire document lists names, race, sex, age, status (soltero(a), casado(a), viudo(a), where they are from, religion, ability to read and write, profession, physical impediment, vaccinated, and language spoken. The residents were 74 payas, 1 Spanish woman, and a 20-year old "indijina," Marcedlina Ortiz [perhaps a Sumo ?]. The oldest person was a 65 year old widow, Rita Duarte, whose profession was "hilandera." The most prominent surnames were the Duarte and Bejarano. The population of Punta de Piedra was 25, all Pallas. Prominent families were mostly los Hernández and Bulnes.

- 2) The "Padron General de Dulce Nombre de Jesus de Payas," of 100 people, was contained in a single booklet, probably incomplete. Therein were listed 53 "Palla," 21 "Español." 12 "yndio," and 6 each "Indigena" and Ladino. There were no definitions for "yndio" and "indigena." Were they Pech or Tawahka . . . or neither?

- 3) Aldea de Pucuyo (pop. 53) and Aldea de Río Paya (pop. 16) are together in another booklet. They were all "Paya" settlements.
- 4) Río Largo, an all—"Palla" Catholic village of 39 shares a booklet with Paon, a dominately—"Sumo" village, far down the Río Wampu. Río Largo was located about 10 km northwest of Culmí, in the upper Wampu flatland. In 1895 39 residents were counted in the census. Prominent surnames were Duarte, Martínez, Catalán, and Rojas.
- 5) Two all-Catholic "palla" villages were along the middle Plátano. Pusquira had 47 residents; Semnica listed 14 "payas," split equally between the sexes. Surnames were Bijarano and Rivas. Downstream, at the river mouth, lived two Paya women, aged 16 and 35. See previous mapping: Cruz 1984: 426; Davidson (1991: 208; 2017: 19)

### **Moreno (Garífuna), 1895.**

The Garífuna, historically, have also been known as caribes, Black Caribs, and Vicentianos, but in the 1895 census they are consistently known as "morenos." Thirty places are recorded, with seventeen listing a population figure. The largest villages with relatively complete censuses are Limón (Aguan, Colón) -- 305 morenos, Cusuna (Iriona, Colón) -- 162 morenos, and Travesia (Puerto Cortéz, Cortéz) – 114 morenos. Masca, on the coast west of Omoa, was known as La Esperanza. There lived 105 morenos and 1 "Inglés." At the other, eastern, extreme of their realm was Plaplaya. Here lived 47 morenos and a ladino named Bruno Vega (25 years old). Prominent surnames were Martínez, Ramírez, and Ortiz.

Garífuna villages in 1895 known to have been large, but without specified populations in the manuscripts are Sangrelaya (Iriona, Colón), Santa Rosa de Aguán, (Aguán, Colón), and Tocomacho (Iriona, Colón). In the 1887 census, residents of the 7 Garifuna villages listed were classified as "ladinos," not "indigenas." (Previous mapping: Cruz 1984: 431, Davidson 1976)

### **Mískitu, 1895.**

Of the 28 Zambo (Mískitu) settlements in the manuscript census of 1895, "Plantain River," at the mouth of Río Plátano, is the largest, where lived 82 zambos. Among them were two Americans: Luis F. Potter and Marion Mathewson, "Protestant comerciantes," 26 and 33 years old, respectively. Also in the village were two Paya women (16 and 33 in age) and a 31 year old ladino man, recently from Nicaragua. The second-largest Zambo village was Brus Lagoon with a population of 65, including 63 "Mosquitos," and 2 Sumu. Other predominantly Zambo places were quite small: Patook River (pop. 42), Cocobila ( pop. 34), and Ují (pop. 22). Yamanta, the largest Mískitu village reported in 1887, with 300 inhabitants, was not found among the 1895 records.

(Previous mapping: Herlihy 1993; Cruz 1984: 426; Davidson 1985: 220; 2017: 19)

### **Sumo (Tawahka), 1895.**

The five sites mentioned in the 1895 census inhabited primarily by the Tawahka (Sumo) are situated near the confluence of the Wampú and Patuca rivers. The transition zone of low hills between the coastal plain of Mosquitia and the high mountains of the interior has been their homeland for centuries (Davidson and Cruz 1988).

Census records for one Sumo village at the confluence of the ríos Wampú and Pau is problematic. The settlement appear in two forms: in the individual 1895 manuscript sheets (Paon) and in the multi-village manuscript reproduced later in this paper (Pau). The former place is described as Paon, municipio Iriona, La Mosquitia. Among its 61 inhabitants are 58 Sumos, two Spanish-speaking Nicaraguans, and Pedro Valdes, a 60-year old pipantero of Zambo ethnicity. Pau, the latter site included completely below, had 37 Sumos, a Paya from Culmí, and a ladino from Managua, Nicaragua. (Previous maps: Cruz 1984: 426; Davidson 1985: 220)

### **Negro Inglés, 1895.**

Only two small sites, Laguna and Gualjipa, were described as being occupied by English-speaking blacks. Laguna is known as a southern barrio of Puerto Cortés; Gualjipa is unlocated. Neither of these places is in the 1887 census.

### **Concluding Remarks.**

The original manuscript documents remaining from the 1895 national census are **remarkable** in that their details allow for the first reconstruction of the ethno-linguistic geography of Honduras. Admittedly, only a partial picture can be presented, but with some comparative support from the published 1887 census, ethnic regions can be suggested.

By looking at both censuses one can also see obvious inconsistencies in how ethnic groups were perceived by census takers. The 1887 census labeled Garífuna as ladinos; they were called "morenos" in the 1895 count.

In spite of being incomplete, the census coverage for 1895 was far better than in 1887 for the Tol, Miskito, Tawahka, and Garifuna settlements. (see Table 2)

## Addendum

# Ethnogeography of the Río Patuca, Honduras, 1895: Settlements, Ethnicity, Migration, and Demography.

### Introduction

Among the several un-cataloged and difficult-to-locate documents housed in the national archives of Honduras in Tegucigalpa is a 13-page census manuscript entitled "*Pliegos Complementarios del Padrón de la Mosquitia - varios caserios y aldeas con 364 [sic] habitantes.*" At the time "La Mosquitia" was a part of the Department of Colón, one of the 15 major subdivisions of Honduras (Fiallos 1980). The document is not dated, but for two reasons it is obvious that it is an isolated part of the unpublished third national census of 1895: 1) the questions posed and ordered in the manuscript are identical to the printed questionnaires used in the census of December 26, 1895 (Davidson 2002: 2a) and 2) the ten settlements reported in the manuscript are not found within the collection of other 1895 census records for La Mosquitia and Colón (Davidson 2002: 1). The incorrect number of inhabitants given in the title is due to a simple arithmetic error -- 339 names, not 364, are listed. As one indication of how remarkable this census is note that the previous census of 1887, and the later ones of 1910 and 1916, did not include six of these villages (Aguasdaban, Crata, Gualpatanta, Pau, Pimienta, Wankibila).


This census is important beyond the new basic settlement/population information. Within are indications of widespread regional migrations and demographic characteristics of the different culture groups. For this period, in an out-of-the-way area of Honduras, such insights are rare.

### Locations and Sizes of the Settlements

The ten settlements reported in the census still exist and are well known. Seven of the places sit atop, or nearby, the banks of the middle and lower Patuca River between Cropunta (Kropunta) and Guanquibila (Wankibila). Another (Pau) is up the Wampú near its confluence with the Patuca. The Wampú is the major tributary of the middle Patuca. The other two *caserios* are on the narrow sands that separate Carataska Lagoon and the Caribbean Sea. The map drawn by government engineer Constantino Fiallos (1909) locates nine of the settlements (see figure 1). Most of these places have been visited by the author.

The villages were small, ranging in population from 18 to 46. Yaurabila was two households of 21 people; Aguasdaban's 46 people were in seven households.

### Ethnic Distributions and Recent Population Movements

Because race and language are recorded, the pattern of ethnic clustering is clear. The distribution of ethnic groups is much as it is today. That is, the six places dominated by the Zambos (now Mískitu) were downstream on the Patuca and around Carataska Lagoon. The predominately Sumo (now Tawahka) villages were four places upstream from the Zambos. Aguasdaban and Gualpatanta, the two most central villages, were "transitional" in that each had representatives of the other group (see table 1). This distribution is shown on the linguistic map produced by the German geographer Karl Sapper following his travels in Honduras, 1898-1900 (West 1990: 133-188). While Sapper never entered the middle Patuca area, he did travel as far east as Catacamas and Culmí and floated down the río Coco to Cape Gracias a Dios from Nicaragua. Of the census villages, Sapper shows only Pau (in a Sumo region) and the limits of the "Mosquitos" up the river seems appropriate (see Figure 3, S = Sumo, Mq = Zambo).

What has changed over the last century, however, is that the transition village is now Krausirpe, a place that has 481 Tawahka and 115 Mískito (Davidson 2011: 210). It is located /22 km upstream from Gualpatanta. In other words, the growth of the Mískito population along the coast and lower rivers has brought their expansion up the Patuca into former Sumo lands. The mass of the Tawahka population now lives above Krausirpe in Krautara and Yapurwas (map Herlihy and Leake 1992; McSweeney 2002).

Figure 2. Sapper's Language Map of Honduras, Mosquitia portion, 1901.




The census indicates that the indigenous folks retain their religion and languages. All ladinos spoke Spanish and were Catholics. The sole Protestant was the English-speaker (Yngles) from Belice. A few ladinos had been vaccinated and some could read and write.

At least five people listed in the census can be found in the historical record. Col. Manuel Fleury (1882: 169, 191), during his mission to report the nature of the new department, noted "Yosenies" as the founder of Walpatanta in 1864; Pedro Martínez as the founder of La Pimienta in 1876; a "Skelton" at Ocotal; and "Matildo" of Reity. They appear in the census as: José Yines," Pedro Martínez, Skelton, and Matildo Sánchez. "Honduras," a 55-year old "zambo" from Ulán, was the only "ganadero" in the census. His land is undoubtedly marked on the map of Fiallos (see figure 1), as is that of "Skelton," who was described by Fleury as an "agent" of the "Mosco king." A final possibility is "Blastnan" who established Ulán in 1856. "Plainsni" appears in the census. Juliana, a 53-year old Suma from Gualpatanta, was described as "*inteligente en medicina*" – a *sukia*.

Population movements of the 1895 residents of the Patuca can be traced from census question six which asked "where are you from?" Aside from the ten census places, 16 source settlements are noted: from the west in Honduras came 17 : Danlí (1), Culmí (1), El Real (2), Gualaco (1), Catacamas (8), Manto (1), and Juticalpa (3), from north and east

of census area in Mosquitia arrived 10: Brus Laguna (2), Patook [boca?] (1), río Sicre (6), and Cauquira (1); from Nicaragua (10): Guaspuc [Waspuk] (1), Principolka (6), Managua (1), Guaco [Boaco] (1), and Jinotega (1); plus one from Belice (1). The 31 in-migrants from "Wanky" are problematic because Cropunta, which housed 30 of those, is known as a very old Mískitu village (Fleury 1882:185).
